#### At the lake with Tony Simons

As part of our rent is keeping the area we use tidy there have been several relatively short but productive weed-clearing sessions cutting back brambles, sweeping fallen leaves, etc.

Tools are on-site in the store secateurs, spade, shovel, broom, rake, and 24-volt hedge cutter please bring gardening gloves, if everyone gives 10 minutes/month it makes light work.

The focus as the weather warms is to get the weed-cutting platform modified and back in use once available the right-hand bank can be trimmed back as overhanging branches have snagged yachts, and the lower growth has attracted powered models both very fast and slow requiring the rescue boat to be deployed, it will also provide a stable platform for trimming the willow tree branches hanging in front of line of vision for racing.

The jack-up platform has been further modified to make it easier to raise and lower I will soon leave the hydraulic jack on site and show a few how to raise and lower the platform.

The step from the ramp onto the platform is to be replaced the new one will be bolted to the platform this will also assist the ramp in stiffening the platform from rocking when raised high.

# Club Contacts - Your Committee



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At a F/E practice day on November 16th he set a blistering top speed of 69 mph. *GO BARRY GO*.

The boat is a Silver Fox hull bought in 2018. It's powered by two Turnigy 3674, 2200kv motors, oil lubricated 4.76mm flex drives turning two 50mm x 1.6 pitch 3 blade props. It runs 6s per motor with  $4 \times 6000$ mAh 3s batteries through  $2 \times 120$ amp ESCs.

It weighs in at 4.1kgs without batteries and the batteries weigh 1.7kgs so 5.8kgs all up.

Congratulations Barry. Can anyone else go faster?



Jason is building a new tug and I am also in the process of building a new Tractor tug.








The pictures show the deck loose fitted, the inside of the tractor tug showing the azimuth drive mounts and the underside shows azimuth drives and skeg.

#### Boats in Dry Dock by Alan

This is a new feature hopefully to be written by you, the members, for interest and the amusement of other members.

For every boat that makes it to the lake there is probably another one sitting awaiting attention of some kind and so it might be of interest to know what we, as a club, have in the reserve fleet. That way, if any members have previous knowledge of the boat concerned (as many will have been through several hands) or have spares which may assist in rebuild further down the line or can proffer tips having built a similar model in the past, these details can be shared. Suggested by Alan Burgess and his is the first model in the Dry Dock.

As you can see this is a large (48") wooden hulled launch - formerly named "Gastema" based upon my judicious use of

sandpaper - which certainly seems to have been through several incarnations. I believe it may have at one stage been steam powered (as there was a club flag inside and there's two patched holes visible on the underside of the cabin roof which I can't otherwise explain) but it's now sporting a large electric motor running a single 3 blade propellor which

requires an additional plate on the stern to address the torque. Whether this is actually sufficient to allow it to sail level at speed remains to be seen as it's not yet touched water under my ownership (although I've a spare 12v lead-acid battery from my





long gone ZZR1200 sitting in the garage which will be utilised when the time comes).

The woodwork on the fore-deck is probably original to the build and I'm in the throes of covering the green painted decking with similar wood strips which will be stained/varnished to provide a more cohesive appearance. The stern area will have a resin dingy mounted to provide a "handle" to allow easier removal from the water plus I've some "previously enjoyed" railings in the spares box to complete the cosmetics before applying a new coat of paint to the hull. Internally, I've already addressed the remounting of the rudder servo plus the water-cooling will be upgraded beyond the short in & out tube. I might even see if I can get the navigation lights working.
